

# The VSCCA Triple Crown

The inaugural year of the VSCCA Triple Crown resulted in an astounding 24 recipients in 2009. There are only 26 Cloisonné remaining. If you were thinking about trying out for this award last year but just could not work yourself around it for logistical reasons, please consider qualifying for it now.

In order to qualify, a club member must run a car in the three different styles of club sanctioned events listed below in a single season: These events represent the nation's newest world class racetrack course; the last true road race in the USA; and the longest consecutively run hill climb in the world and the most historic venue on the VSCCA calendar. Having raced in all three events, the president of the VSCCA, John Schieffelin, will award The Triple Crown to each racer at the Annual General Meeting in November.

The VSCCA Triple Crown is a museum quality Vitreous Cloisonné Enamel Grille Badge. The badge itself was produced by Mark Richards, Managing Director of Car Badges Direct, and designed by Joseph DeLucia. To recognize the importance of the achievement, the Grille Badge itself is gold plated. As there are only 50, consecutively numbered badges, this Cloisonné is sure to become a collectors piece.
