

# TRIPLE CROWN VSCCA



The Vintage Sports Car Club of America announces the creation of their first official Triple Crown.

In order to qualify, a club member must run a car in the three different styles of VSCCA sanctioned races in the 2009 season: the nation's newest world class **racetrack course** (The New Jersey Vintage Grand Prix Festival, May 29-31<sup>st</sup>); the last true **road race** in the USA (Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix, July 18-19); and the longest consecutively run **hill climb** in the world (the Mt Equinox Hill Climb on August 22-23). Having competed in all three events, the president of the VSCCA, John Schieffelin, will award The Triple Crown to each racer at the Annual General Meeting in November.

The VSCCA Triple Crown is a museum quality Vitreous Cloisonné Enamel Grille Badge. The badge itself is designed by Mark Richards, Managing Director of Car Badges Direct, Joseph DeLucia and Jack Gallagher. Richards, a member of the Vintage Triumph Register and a vintage sports car owner himself claims “The only vintage club in the world, let alone any racing club, that could pull something like this off is the VSCCA”.

To recognize the importance of this achievement, the Grille Badge is gold plated. As there are only 50 consecutively numbered badges, this Cloisonné is sure to become a valuable piece of vintage racing history.

**NOTE: Because the Mount Equinox Hill Climb has a limited number of entries available, if you plan to qualify for the VSCCA Triple Crown, you should secure your entry as early as possible in this event.**
